Course Title: 10 Mentored Births

Course Credits: 24.0

Course Description: The BSM candidate thoroughly evaluates their anticipation of possible risks and provision of all areas of care for each of the 10 clients, identifies problems, and implements changes in their practice and methods to improve future care. This course requires 1 clinical year past licensing or certification to include 10 births mentored by preceptor chart review. The BSM candidate and mentoring preceptor together complete a chart review for each of the 10 births. The mentoring preceptor(s) need not attend the births. This requirement may be completed concurrently with enrollment in the BSM program.

Learning Activities:

- 1. At least 1 Clinical year past licensing or certification, to include:
- 2. Clinical care of 10 clients following licensing or certification, including Antepartum, Intrapartum, Postpartum, Newborn, and Well Woman.
- 3. Complete clinical care of these 10 clients mentored by Preceptor chart review.

Learning Materials / Resources:

- 1. Most recent texts, journal articles, web-searches, in-services, conferences, continuing education as necessitated by an active midwifery practice and by requirements for licensure.
- 2. Midwifery Practice Guidelines-as appropriate to the location in which the Student practices midwifery.

Evaluation Tools / Methods:

- 1. Chart reviews should demonstrate a comprehensive inspection of all areas of the BSM candidate's care as a midwife of each of the 10 clients.
- 2. Chart reviews should demonstrate the BSM candidate's adherence to and understanding of their practice guidelines.
- Chart reviews should reflect a thorough review of current literature and best current practices in midwifery care.

- 4. Review outcomes for improvement of the quality of services.
- 5. Implement quality improvement measures based on a review of outcomes.

Course Credit:
